- 1. The donation is consistent with the principles outlined in Section 1 of the *Police Services Act*.
- 2. The donation supports the objectives and priorities of the Police Services Board and will provide a direct benefit to the community at large.
- 3. The acceptance of the donation does not compromise or bring into question police impartiality or objectivity.
- 4. The acceptance of the donation does not commit the Durham Regional Police to additional, unbudgeted resources, unless approved by the Board.
- 5. The donation is without conditions as to its use or preference to the donor.
- 6. No donation valued at more than \$5,000 is to be accepted without the thorough background check and the express permission of the Board.
- 7. All donations must be properly documented including at least the source of the gift, its nature and its size or significance.
- 8. All donations received by the Police Service will be reported to the Board annually.
- 9. Procedures are developed to ensure compliance with this policy.

Based on the above proof provided, I report compliance with the policy at this point in the reporting cycle.
