1. The donation is consistent with the principles outlined in Section 1 of the *Police Services Act*.

2. The donation supports the objectives and priorities of the Police Services Board and will provide a

direct benefit to the community at large.

3. The acceptance of the donation does not compromise or bring into question police impartiality or

objectivity.

4. The acceptance of the donation does not commit the Durham Regional Police to additional,

unbudgeted resources, unless approved by the Board.

5. The donation is without conditions as to its use or preference to the donor.

6. No donation valued at more than \$5,000 is to be accepted without the thorough background check

and the express permission of the Board.

7. All donations must be properly documented including at least the source of the gift, its nature and

its size or significance.

8. All donations received by the Police Service will be reported to the Board annually.

9. Procedures are developed to ensure compliance with this policy.

Based on the above proof provided, I report compliance with the policy at this point in the

reporting cycle.
