2. **That policy requirement #8 for individual donor criminal and background record checks be amended to only be applied to donations larger than \$5,000 and that it would be part of the Board's approval of the donation prior to the acceptance of any such donation.**

**BROADEST POLICY PROVISION:**

The Board recognizes the generosity of citizens, community agencies and corporations in supporting the Durham Regional Police through donations of money, equipment, and other goods and services. The Board is committed to ensuring that the acceptance of such donations be subject to a clear, transparent and accountable process.

**Interpretation of the Chief of Police:**

I shall ensure that all such donations are recorded properly and that proposed donations valued at more than \$5,000 are presented for Board approval prior to acceptance.

## **Data Support:**

The following is a list of all donations of money, showing the donor, amount of donation and which program the donation was used to support.

All the donations on the list meet the 10 specific policy goals below subject to the qualification in the transitional provision noted above.

1. The donation is consistent with the principles outlined in Section 1 of the *Police Services Act*.
2. The donation supports the objectives and priorities of the Police Services Board and will provide a direct benefit to the community at large.
3. The acceptance of the donation does not compromise or bring into question police impartiality or objectivity.
4. The acceptance of the donation does not commit the Durham Regional Police to additional, unbudgeted resources, unless approved by the Board.
5. The donation is without conditions as to its use or preference to the donor.
6. No donation valued at more than \$5,000 is to be accepted without the express permission of the Board.
7. All donations must be properly documented including at least the source of the gift, its nature and its size or significance.
8. Donations are not accepted from a person whose background, including criminal record, lifestyle, or association, would cause, or have the potential to cause, embarrassment to the Board.
9. All donations received by the Police Service will be reported to the Board annually.
10. Procedures are developed to ensure compliance with this policy.
