


#### Calls for Service



Compared to Last Q1				
Priority	Difference	% Difference		
Emergency	+314	+17%		
Urgent	+1,214	+15%		
Routine	+698	+4%		
TOTAL	+2,226	+9%		


- Overall call volume 9% higher than last year; and 3% per cent higher than the 5-year average
- Calls related to unsheltered population have increased significantly since start of pandemic
- Six call types account for one-third of total citizen call volume and about 25% of the total time spent on scene for reactive calls

## Calls for Service - Emergency



- Sharp increase in number of emergency calls
  - +17% over last YTD
  - +13% over 5-year average
- Median emergency response time exceeds 8 minutes
  (8m:13s) & is the longest response time in past 5 years
- Time spent on scene of emergency calls is increasing
  - Median time spent at the scene of an emergency call is nearly 2 hours, a 45-minute increase when compared to 5 years ago.


#### Reported Crime - Violent

Property	+747	+25%		
Other Criminal Code	+162	+13%		

- Slight increase in violent crime year-over-year
- Five (5) shootings in Q1, resulting in three deaths
  - One-quarter (25%) of persons charged with a firearm offence were breaching a condition of release
- Much of the increase is driven by lower severity crimes such as simple assault, threatening and harassment
- Sexual assault reports continue an upward trend


### Reported Crime - Property

Property	+747	+25%		
Other Criminal Code	+162	+13%		

- Large increase in property crime reports. Major trends include:
  - Thefts of high-end vehicles
  - Increase in shoplifting and other thefts
- Stolen vehicle reports continue to rise as luxury vehicles targeted for export
- Organized thefts from retail locations on the rise

# Traffic Safety



Compared to Last Q1				
Category	Difference	% Difference		
Fatal	+4	N/A		
Injury	-1	No change		
Property Damage	+436	+22%		

- Property damage collisions rising while injury-causing collisions remain unchanged
- Collisions numbers consistent with pre-pandemic levels
- Four fatal collisions reported in Q1. Well above last year, but consistent with long-term average
